PANELIST GUIDELINES:

Introduction:

- Panelists will be introduced by the moderator who will be provided with their professional credentials.
- Moderator will invite each panelist to share a brief (3 min) overview of advice/wisdom based on area of expertise. Choose a few things to highlight; will be able to get more specific during the discussion.

Guided discussion:

- *Q&A from the audience will be reserved until the end*
- The moderator will ask a series of questions. Please prepare for these beforehand.
- Panelists do not need to answer each question, just they feel most qualified to speak on. The moderator will most likely direct questions to one or two panelists.
- In the interest of time, please answer questions in a succinct a manner as possible
- Panelists should think of one or two questions to ask other panelists that the moderator perhaps might not think to ask.
