

Housing Stabilization Program



The Center for Housing Opportunities' (CHO) Housing Stabilization Program (HSP) is a housing crisis intervention program that provides one-time or short term (up to 4 months) financial assistance to households who are facing a temporary, non-reoccurring housing crisis.

One-time funding support includes:

1) Move-in assistance which may include:

- First month's rent
- Last month's rent
- Security deposit
- Utility deposits

2) Utilities in arrears

3) Rent in arrears

4) Legal fees

Short-term funding support includes:

- 1) Rent subsidy, not to exceed four (4) months
- 2) Legal services throughout the eviction process
- 3) Legal fees related to court

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be a renter
- Must live in the City of Pittsburgh
- Household at 50% AMI or below*
- Must develop a stability plan with a service provider
