
Lower Hill Redevelopment

On June 10, 2021, the URA Board will take a historic vote on the Lower Hill Redevelopment project. If the Board approves the vote, it will allow developers to close on Blocks G-1 and G-4 to build a mixed-use tower that will become the new headquarters of First National Bank and public open space. This will be the first closing on the Lower Hill site.

The development team has committed to several community benefits in an Open Letter to the Hill District Community. This final vote on the G-1 and G-4 parcels will set the stage for the community benefits listed on the reverse side of this sheet.









Community Capital Investment

- Development team to make an upfront investment of \$7.5M in future tax revenue from the Lower Hill Redevelopment to fund housing and economic development activities in the Greater Hill District
- Development team committed to raising a \$5M
 Opportunity Zone Fund for direct investment in real estate projects in the Hill District
- FNB committed to investing an additional \$5M toward closing gap funding for real estate projects in the Hill District
- FNB committed to investing an additional \$2M to support small to medium-sized businesses in the Hill District
- Development team committed to meeting with the CCIP Executive Management Committee to consider a crowd-sourcing funding mechanism for future developments on the Lower Hill
