Category Number	Category Name	Category Description
1.	Administration	<p>Those processes and activities related to the management of the Greater Hill District Neighborhood Reinvestment Fund, including the administration of the Community Collaboration and Implementation Plan.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> this does not include fees due to the URA and Pittsburgh Public Schools</p>
2.	Children and Youth Education Initiatives	<p>Those programs, projects, processes, and activities that provide educational services to children and youth. These funds are restricted to those organizations providing services to the children and youth of the Greater Hill District.</p>
3.	Rent Assistance Subsidies	<p>Financial assistance to defray a portion of the total amount of expenses due to monthly rent and/or utilities for renters experiencing financial hardship. These funds are restricted to those persons renting a housing unit within the Greater Hill District geographic area.</p>
4.	Mortgage Assistance Subsidies	<p>Financial assistance to defray a portion of the total amount of expenses due to monthly mortgage payments, taxes, and/or utilities for homeowners experiencing financial hardship. These funds are only available to those persons who own a home within the Greater Hill District.</p>
5.	Job Placement Programs	<p>Those programs that connect employees and employers. These funds are restricted to programs that assist (i) job seekers who live within the Greater Hill District, (ii) employers located in the Greater Hill District, and (iii) employers who intend to hire job seekers who live within the Greater Hill District.</p>

6.	Workforce Development Initiatives	<p>Those programs, projects, processes, and activities that further the efforts of (i) social services, community supports, job training, and education that position individuals for success in the workforce and (ii) training programs that provide existing and potential workers with the skills to complete tasks needed by employers to let the organizations stay competitive in a global market.</p> <p>These funds are restricted to those services and programs that aid workers and job seekers that live in the Greater Hill District.</p>
7.	Development Initiatives	<p>Those programs, projects, processes, and activities that further the improvement of land and structures.</p> <p>These funds are restricted to supporting to commercial and mixed-use (<i>i.e.</i> , commercial and residential) development initiatives within the Greater Hill District.</p>
8.	Housing Initiatives	<p>Those programs, projects, processes, and activities that further the construction and/or improvement of housing.</p> <p>These funds are restricted to housing located within the Greater Hill District.</p>
9.	Project Development	<p>Those processes and activities undertaken to create a unique product, service, or result.</p> <p>Priority will be given to non-residential, community-focused projects.</p> <p>These funds are restricted to projects undertaken in the Greater Hill District.</p>
10.	M/WBE Development Initiatives	<p>Those programs, projects, processes, and activities focused on the formation and growth of M/WBEs.</p> <p>These funds are restricted to supporting M/WBEs either based in the Greater Hill District or undertaking a project located in the Greater Hill District.</p>

11.	M/WBE Business Counseling Initiatives	Those programs, projects, processes, and activities providing technical assistance ( <i>i.e.</i> , advice, guidance, or instruction) on the formation, management, financing, and operation of M/WBE businesses. These funds are restricted to supporting M/WBEs either based in the Greater Hill District or undertaking a project located in the Greater Hill District.
12.	Historic Hill Institutional Preservation	Any expenditure made or estimated to be made, or monetary obligations incurred or estimated to be incurred which are listed in a program or project plan as costs associated with the preservation of Hill District institutions. Priority consideration will be given to those historic Hill institutions that have difficulties accessing traditional funding such as federal grants, loans, etc.
13.	Reoccurring Revenue Initiatives Under Community Control	Expenditures used to support or fund programs, projects, processes, or activities that leverage and/or invest GHDNRF proceeds in such a way that they produce funding, whether interest, dividends, or equity returns, to be returned to Hill District residents, institutions, organizations, or businesses.
14.	Other Wealth Building Initiatives	Those programs, projects, processes, and activities focused on generating wealth for existing residents and business-owners within the Greater Hill District.
